The school corporation did not transfer more than 15% of its revenue from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund in calendar year 2021 and was only placed on the list because of the late submission of th eForm 9. The board acknowledged the placement and gave permission to post the notice on the school corporation website with a motion from Catherine Stockwell, seconded by Jeff Saucerman, and a vote of 5-0.
